



The Meridian Bridge


Prior to the construction of the Meridian Bridge, travelers would cross the Missouri River via ferries, rafts, walking on ice, and a pontoon bridge that could only be used during certain months. Deloss B. Gurney, a prominent seed merchant, was motivated by a desire to ensure Yankton's economic future as a center of trade. Gurney wanted a bridge to replace a ferry and a seasonally operated pontoon bridge that limited transportation south from Yankton to markets in rural northeastern Nebraska. In 1919, Gurney led Yanktonians in forming and funding the Meridian Highway Bridge Company. Gurney's efforts aided in a final link of the Continental Meridian Highway, now known as US HWY 81, an early North-South route from Winnipeg, Canada, to Mexico City, Mexico. Two years later, construction of the Meridian Bridge began. The bridge was built with a double-deck in anticipation that the lower deck would be made available to a railroad.


Officially dedicated on October 11, 1924, the completed \$1.1 million Meridian Bridge was a symbol of local pride, in large part because it had been built under local leadership. Yankton hosted an 8-day celebration full of food, entertainment, parades, and fireworks. More than 100,000 visitors from around the region traveled to participate in the festivities. Community pride and hospitality continued as local churches and organizations opened their doors to feed guests, and the local legion organized "tent cities," a twist on modern day hotels where visitors could rent a tent for the night. In order to reimburse investors, a toll booth was implemented after the bridge's opening with rates of 50 cents per car and driver, and 10 cents for each additional passenger. In 1953, the wife of D.B. Gurney paid the last toll, and the bridge was converted into a free facility.

Since its initial completion, the bridge has undergone several rehabilitation projects within its first 76-years of life. The most significant alteration to the bridge occurred in 1983 when the lift span ceased to be movable. The towers remain, defining what was the vertical lift span. Added to the National Register of Historic Places in May 1993, the bridge retains its original configuration and is today distinguished as the only vertical lift span in Nebraska and South Dakota.

After a 10-ton gross weight limit was placed on the Meridian Bridge, a nearly \$5 million dollar conversion project went underway to allow for continued pedestrian and bike use, including structural repairs, spot painting, lighting, and railings. In November 2011, the Meridian Bridge reopened for recreational use and is a popular outdoor activity enjoyed by both locals and visitors. This project is expected to extend the lifespan of the bridge by at least another 25 years. The newly constructed Discovery Bridge opened for traffic on October 11, 2009, exactly 84 years after the dedication of the Meridian Highway Bridge. Yankton continues to hold a local nickname of "Bridge City."

As we celebrate the Meridian Bridge Centennial Year, we reflect on the rich history and significance of this iconic structure. Standing as a testament to the resilience of our community, the Meridian Bridge has connected generations and served as a symbol of unity. This milestone year is an opportunity to honor the bridge's legacy, acknowledge its role in shaping our city's identity, and envision a future where it continues to be a vital link between people, places, and memories.



















HUNTING & FISHING

HUNTING

Hunting is a South Dakota tradition that has brought generations of families together since the area was settled. Southeastern South Dakota is rich with year-round opportunities including turkey, deer, geese, and waterfowl to name a few. In addition, the Chinese Ring-necked Pheasant, South Dakota's state bird, thrives in our area's habitat and offers longstanding traditions of group hunts with both residents and visitors alike.


For many, hunting means more than reaching a limit. It means reconnecting with old friends to make new memories while experiencing the peace of nature. It means passing years of hunting experience on to the next generation. After a good hunt, friends and families gather around tables to share home-cooked meals, stories, and laughter. Hunting fills the belly, but most importantly, it fills the soul.


FISHING

Anglers are also drawn to Yankton throughout the year. With three large bodies of water all within 10 miles of each other, anglers can try different fishing styles each day. Lewis and Clark Lake and the Missouri River are open to boating without horsepower restrictions, allowing for effective boat fishing, especially in colder weather when fish are typically in deeper water. Gavins Point Dam's cool, flowing waters attract fish year long, making the Dam a popular spot for shore fishing. Lastly, Lake Yankton is unique as it does not allow gas motors; providing the perfect water for kayaks, canoes, and boats with trolling motors. Anglers have luck ice fishing in the wintertime as well.

Popular species include walleye, bass (largemouth, smallmouth, white), catfish, pike, and panfish. Snagging paddlefish season is Oct. 1-31 and bowfishing paddlefish season is July 1-31. Our waters border Nebraska, so please be mindful to follow our local fishing regulations when planning a trip.





KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Plan ahead. Bring along water to stay hydrated. No food, no fuel, no fun! Check the weather forecast, water levels, and wind conditions for your destination. Plan clothing, equipment and supplies accordingly. South Dakota State Park Entrance Licenses run \$8/day pass or \$36 for annual pass.



BOAT RENTALS & WATER SAFETY

Before and after a trip, wash your gear and support vehicle to reduce the spread of invasive species. Carry a Coast Guard approved life vest for each person. Always maintain your watercraft at a manageable speed. Top off your boat tank before leaving the marina. Be a sportsman; practice catch and release and keep only what you need.



STICK TO THE TRAILS

Help natural areas stay natural by sticking to designated trails and campsites. Even though shortcuts can be tempting, please do not take them. A few extra strides on the path will protect plants and the homes of our wildlife.



TRASH THE TRASH

Pack it in, pack it out. Take litter, crumbs, peels, and cores with you until you can dispose of them in your nearest waste bin. Detergents, toothpaste and soap harm fish and other aquatic life – use biodegradable when possible.



LEAVE IT AS YOU FOUND IT

Leave plants and rocks as you find them so others can experience the joy of discovery. South Dakota is beautiful all on its own. Carving or hacking into trees or rocks harms and disfigures them, impacting their vitality.



KEEP WILDLIFE WILD

Wildlife can be cute, but feeding wild animals isn't. You can alter their natural behaviors, exposing them to predators or even euthanasia. Always keep your dogs leashed when enjoying the trails and pack out their waste.



BE CAREFUL WITH FIRE

Observe all fire restrictions. Keep campfires small to avoid sparking wildfires. Never let a fire burn unattended. Always put cigarettes out completely and don't leave the butts behind. Allow the wood to burn down to a fine ash, if possible. Pour water on the fire and drown all embers until the hissing sound stops. Stir the campfire ashes and embers until everything is wet and cold to the touch. If you don't have water, use dirt.



SHARE THE TRAILS & PARKS

Be considerate of others on the roads and trails. Yield to the uphill hiker and biker - they need momentum! On roads and trails, horses always have the right of way. Be considerate of other campers' privacy - keep your distance and avoid traveling through their campsites. Keep your pets under control. Keep noise to a minimum, especially in the early morning and evening hours, so all can enjoy the peace of South Dakota.







YANKTON'S History

Home to the Yankton Sioux, or Ihanktonwan in the Dakota language, Yankton means "Those Who Camp at the End." In 1859, Yankton was a virtually treeless campsite occupied by people of the Ihanktonwan Nation on the banks of the Missouri River. Two years later, it became the first capital of the newly created Dakota Territory and transformed into a rollicking river port. Settlers were drawn to the river access and progressive way of life. Yankton is home to South Dakota's first ever bank, newspaper, high school, college, medical clinic, and bridge across the Missouri River. Yankton has always been a place of opportunity, vision, and entrepreneurialism!

1804 LEWIS AND CLARK

Lewis & Clark passed the Ihanktonwan (Yankton) Nation encamped near what became the City of Yankton on their expedition in 1804. They met with the Ihanktonwan Nation leaders on the Calumet Bluffs, now near Gavins Point Dam. Lewis & Clark provided gifts to the Ihanktonwan people and spent several days learning their way of life before continuing their journey up the Missouri River.

1860s-1870s ECONOMIC TRADE HUB

Located on the Missouri River, Yankton was a large river port, political powerhouse, and economic center for the upper Midwest. The city grew as a stop for steamboats to take on supplies and fresh water, especially after steamboat traffic boomed during the Black Hills gold rush.



1861-1883 DAKOTA TERRITORIAL CAPITOL BUILDING

In 1861, Yankton was designated as the Dakota territorial capital. Dakota Territory originally included present day South Dakota, North Dakota, Montana, and Wyoming. The name refers to the Dakota branch of the Sioux tribes which occupied the area at the time. Construction of the capitol building began in November 1862. In 1989, a replica of the building was built at Riverside Park thanks to the Yankton Sertoma Club.

1876 THE WILD WEST

Wild Bill Hickok, a sheriff and former gunslinger, was gunned down in a saloon in Deadwood. His accused killer, Jack McCall, was brought to Yankton, the location of the U.S. Marshal Office for Dakota Territory, for his trial. McCall was convicted of murder and publicly hanged at age 24. His body is buried in a newly marked grave in Yankton at the border of the Yankton City Cemetery and Sacred Heart Cemetery.

1879 DAKOTA HOSPITAL FOR THE INSANE

Due to the overcrowded conditions in facilities that catered to the mentally ill in neighboring areas, the Territorial Legislature approved a dedicated mental hospital in Yankton. This institution, originally named the Dakota Hospital for the Insane, commenced its operations within two wooden structures, both personally funded by Governor Howard. Subsequently in 1974, a more encompassing title, the South Dakota Human Services Center, was adopted to better align with the comprehensive range of services provided by the institution.



1909-1980'S THE MEAD MUSEUM

The Mead Building initially served as residential quarters for female patients at Yankton State Hospital from 1909 to the 1980s. Honoring the legacy of Superintendent Dr. Leonard C. Mead, the building underwent a transformative rehabilitation and reopened in 2018 as a distinguished museum and cultural center. Presently, the Mead Museum boasts an impressive collection of over 45,000 historic artifacts and hosts traveling exhibits throughout the year.

Before the Meridian Bridge was built, people would cross the Missouri River via ferries, rafts, walking on ice, and a pontoon bridge that could only be used during certain months. Finally in 1919, Yanktonians formed and funded the Meridian Highway Bridge Company. Two years later, construction of the Meridian Bridge began. The bridges completion was one of the final links of the Continental Meridian Highway, now known as US HWY 81, an early north-south route from Winnipeg, Canada, to Mexico City, Mexico.

1957 GAVINS POINT DAM

Constructed under Congressional direction, Gavins Point Dam serves a dual purpose: regulating river flows and generating power for 68,000 homes through its hydroelectric plant. Beyond power generation, the dam excels in flood control, improved irrigation, pollution abatement, sediment control, and wildlife preservation. It also provides recreational opportunities and vital water supplies for municipalities and industries. Positioned as the last dam on the Missouri River before it flows to the Gulf of Mexico, Gavins Point Dam forms the popular Lewis and Clark Lake, drawing two million visitors annually. This engineering marvel seamlessly blends environmental stewardship with recreational appeal, embodying both practicality and natural beauty.





Fun Facts About Yankton

- 1. Yankton was the first capitol of the Dakota Territory.
- 2. Tom Brokaw, former television journalist and author, graduated from Yankton High School and is a strong community supporter. Our local trail system, the Auld-Brokaw Trail, is a great way to explore on foot or bike.
- **3.** Gavins Point Dam is the last dam on the Missouri River, so if you wanted, you could hop in a boat and float all the way to the Gulf of Mexico!
- **4.** Our Yankton Federal Prison Camp was formerly Yankton College, where Lyle Alzado played before his NFL career.
- 5. In the wintertime, you can see a large gathering of bald eagles near Gavins Point Dam and in the surrounding area. They come here to hunt where there is open water below the dam.
- **6.** Jack McCall, who shot Wild Bill Hickock in Deadwood, was tried, and hanged in Yankton in 1877.
- **7.** NFL's all-time leading scorer, Adam Vinatieri, was born in Yankton in 1972.
- **8.** As the "Neighbor Lady", Winifred (Wynn) Speece shared recipes, household tips, and personal anecdotes during her weekday program. At the height of her fame in the 1940s and 1950s, she received over 250,000 letters a year. Speece received a Marconi Radio Award in 1992.
- **9.** Lawrence Welk and his band was the station band for WNAX radio. The accordionist, bandleader, and television impresario also hosted The Lawrence Welk Show from 1951 to 1982.
- 10. The Meridian Bridge piers were built by underwater construction workers known as "sandhogs." The piers were covered with a smooth metal rumored to have been salvaged from a World War I battleship. The wedge-shaped piers and metal covering were chosen to help break apart floating ice and debris.
